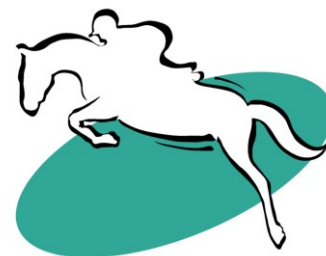

The prize for 6<sup>th</sup> (5.5%) is then given to the winner, the prize for 7<sup>th</sup> (4%) is given to the 2<sup>nd</sup> placed athlete, the prize for 8<sup>th</sup> (3%) is given to the 3<sup>rd</sup> placed athlete, the prize for 9<sup>th</sup> (3%) is given to the 4<sup>th</sup> placed athlete and the prize for 10<sup>th</sup> (2.5%) is given to the 5<sup>th</sup> placed athlete.
